

## Tourist information about the venue

### Uferstadt Fürth / The Plant

- Located along the banks of the river Pegnitz, on the site of the former spa complex of Fürth<sup>2</sup>
- During the imperial era: spa complex with spring, place of excursions for the people of Fürth and Nuremberg<sup>3</sup> (spa house and the fountain house of the "König-Ludwig-Quelle I" of the König-Ludwig-Bad are still on the site today<sup>2</sup>)
- After the First World War, there was no success, the grounds lay largely fallow<sup>3</sup>
- After the Second World War, Max Grundig acquired the spa complex, on which he founded the RVF Elektrotechnische Fabrik in 1947, which later became Grundig AG<sup>3</sup>
- Up to 800 employees produced in 25 factory halls and administration buildings. The monthly production amounted to 12,000 radios, the market share was 20 percent, Grundig was thus the market leader.
- After the Grundig company gave up the site, the "Uferstadt Fürth" was built from 2001 onwards, which today serves as a research and business park for the city of Fürth<sup>1</sup> and also houses various FAU facilities.

### Rundfunkmuseum

- Broadcasting Museum of the City of Fürth since 29 October 1993, at that time in the annexe of Burgfarrnbach Castle<sup>9, 10</sup>
- Since 2001 in the old Grundig management building in the Uferstadt Fürth<sup>10</sup>
- Exhibits from the fields of radio, television and consumer electronics<sup>9</sup>
- History of the Grundig Company<sup>9</sup>
- Over one hundred years of radio history on more than 750 square metres of exhibition space<sup>11</sup>
- Focus on technology and social relevance of the medium of broadcasting<sup>10</sup>
- Owns one of the largest collections on the history of broadcasting in Germany<sup>8</sup>
- Focus: Capturing and preserving people's personal memories (contemporary witnesses of regional industrial history and broadcasting history as well as consumers of broadcasting)<sup>8</sup>

## Comödie Fürth / Berolzheimerianum

- One of the most beautiful Art Nouveau buildings in Fürth<sup>13</sup>
- 1904 donated by Heinrich Berolzheimer, Jewish pencil manufacturer and honorary citizen of Fürth<sup>12</sup>
- 1906 ceremonial opening in the presence of Prince Ludwig of Bavaria<sup>13</sup>
- Built as a people's library and people's educational home for the working class<sup>12</sup>
- 1998 Renovation by the four operators (Volker Heißmann, Martin Rassau, Marcel Gasde and Michael Urban)<sup>14</sup>
- The Art Nouveau building is listed<sup>14</sup>
- Today: "Comödie Fürth" (guest theatre with a total of 460 seats) with "Grüner Brauhaus" pub with adjoining brewery<sup>14</sup>

## Kofferfabrik

- Building was constructed in the middle of the 19th century and is one of the last remaining industrial buildings on the city border to Nuremberg<sup>5</sup>
- 19th century: Manufacture of mirrors<sup>5</sup>
- From 1919: production of suitcases by the Bermas company<sup>5, 7</sup>
- In the 1980s, production of all kinds of suitcases by the Bermas company was discontinued on the site<sup>5</sup>
- Independent cultural centre since 1994<sup>4</sup>
- Today the suitcase factory houses a pub, a beer garden, a gallery and four open stages<sup>5</sup>
- Independent cultural centre in Fürth<sup>6</sup>
- Meeting place of the (sub-)cultural scene from Fürth and Nuremberg<sup>6</sup>
